From 1979 to 1991 she was a correspondent and columnist for the Chronicle of Higher Education, and later a senior writer there. She has won numerous national awards, including the Excellence in Journalism Award and the Pearl Warren Award for distinguished writing. Her dispatches on the 1991 Los Angeles riots—during which she witnessed rioters pillage the UCLA campus—were published in the Chronicle on December 30, 1991. The piece drew condemnation from readers who believed that Andrijasevic was too sympathetic to the rioters. The title of the article was "Los Angeles is a crime-ridden, angry and dangerous city these days, but let's calm down." The journal decided not to publish a retraction of this article, and Andrijasevic later apologized for her actions. Her 1994 book, *City of Fear: Russians and America at the End of the Cold War* was a best-seller, and has been translated into 14 languages. The book won the Edgar Award from the Mystery Writers of America in 1995. Her second book, *I Presume You Are Talking About Me: A Portrait of Life in Moscow* (now published by the University of Chicago Press) was a New York Times selection for the 2004 Pulitzer Prize. She has written on subjects from the Soviet Union to Putin's Russia, and in 1995 she was awarded the Jaume Cabré Award in Barcelona. Andrijasevic has taught journalism at the University of Denver and University of California, Los Angeles. She has also taught and was the director of continuing education for (now the Institute of International Education) and is the editor and translator of the Russian-language Lonely Planet guidebook, *Moscow*. Andrijasevic has taught in Russia and abroad, and now lives in San Francisco.
